Introduction

Emergency Response to farm incidents remains a challenge to rescue services. It is also challenging when less personnel in today's rural departments have an agricultural background. We are providing a program designed for EMT's and rescue personnel, to supplement basic emergency training with training for dealing with agricultural incidents. This program will challenge your knowledge regarding some specific farm incident situations while providing "take home and use" information.

Location

Train-the-Trainer Course

On October 25, we will be offering a separate, in-depth train-the-trainer course on how to organize and conduct an Agricultural Rescue Training. Workshops

A – Tractor Rollover

More common tractor overturns and discussion of stabilization techniques as well as emergency medical concerns with hands on experience will be showcased in this workshop.

B – Equipment Extrication

Principles of machinery extrication will be discussed as well as hands on incident size-up, extrication and patient handling will be performed in this workshop.

C – Confined Spaces on the Farm

This workshop will involve an identification of various confined spaces on the farm and a presentation of what is needed successfully perform a confined space rescue. Participants will gain hands-on experience practicing a confined space rescue. *SCBA is required if participating in this workshop!*

D – Grain Bin Rescue

Similar to the silo rescue, grain bins have their own unique hazards. Utilizing safety equipment, this workshop will be an on scene presentation of the needs to perform a safe rescue from a grain bin.

E – Large Animal Rescue

This workshop will give participants multiple skills and techniques to safely contain, approach and manipulate recumbent large animals in emergency situations. Safe working zones, equipment options, proper strap placement, manipulation techniques, and more on thousand-pound mannequins will be covered.

RF-DASH Training

A Rural Firefighters Delivering Agricultural Safety and Health (RF-DASH) training will take place on October 24. This program focuses on injury prevention and preplanning and is a good complement to the ART trainings. Go to agrescue.org for more information.
